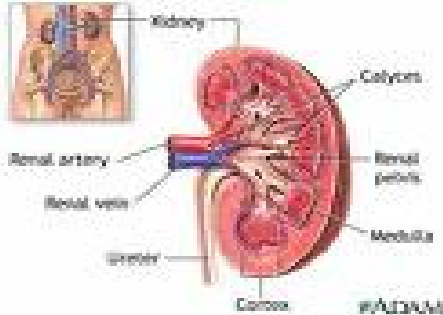

We are currently studying the CPR railway. We are discussing the surveying before the actual building

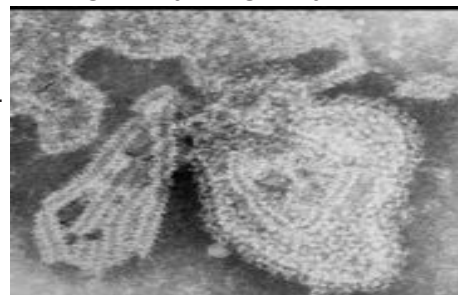
BUSH AND CHENEY ARE THREATENED IN VERMONT

MUMPS EPIDEMIC IN CHILLIWACK, BC RAISES CONCERN

Chilliwack, BC- Health officials in BC are aware of the likely spread of Mumps, after 20 cases of the extremely contagious virus were reported in Chilliwack, BC. Mumps is a virus that spreads with saliva and infects wherever the saliva goes. Painful swelling of the salivary glands (classically the parotid gland) and fever is the most typical presentation. Painful testicular swelling and rash also may occur. According to Dr. Gillian Aresenault, the Fraser Valley Regional Medical Health Officer, the health officials are doing everything they can to vaccinate around it to stop it from spreading any further.
